

Dear Members of Faith Lutheran Church,

Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ! I am writing to you with deep gratitude and excitement as I begin a new chapter in my journey of faith and ministry. As many of you know, I have recently started seminary at Wartburg Seminary, and the experience has been both humbling and invigorating.
